

Clinician Teacher (CT) Academic Position Description

Recommended timeframes: 10% time = one half day = four - five hours = 0.5 ER shifts

Administrative Service (hospital, department, university) *Applies to Full-time Clinical Faculty Only	 For full-time clinical faculty, prior to Continuing Faculty Appointment Review (CFAR): not required and not recommended, except when directly relevant to scholarly or teaching interests. Post-CFAR: full-time clinical faculty members are expected to contribute 5% to 10% of their time to service to the hospital, department and/or University. Service to the University includes activities such as serving on grant review panels, work with national societies or the Royal College, etc. that does not directly benefit the individual. CFAR neither applies to part-time nor adjunct clinical faculty.
