UofT Strong Presence at Annual Canadian Geriatrics Society Conference in "La Belle Province"

The 32nd Annual Canadian Geriatrics Society Scientific Meeting was hosted in Quebec City on April 19-21 and was well attended by faculty and trainees.

Colleagues from across the country converged to share advances in research and fresh perspectives surrounding the care of older adults. New to this year's proceedings was a "Medical Student Day" that featured a keynote address by Dr. Roger Wong, CGS President, followed by lectures and workshops geared towards trainees. The day concluded with a networking dinner event.

As part of the trainee-focused proceedings, Geriatric Medicine resident Dr. Karen D'Silva (PGY5) facilitated a gait/falls assessment workshop, discussing falls as a geriatric syndrome and how risk factors can be revealed as part of a focused history, functional

and physical examination. Building on skills honed in the Master Teacher program, Karen engaged participants to integrate their own clinical experiences in learning about methods for assessing gait and performing balance tests.

Karen's abstract, "Does this patient with LUTS have benign prostatic hypertrophy with bladder outlet obstruction?", was also accepted for a poster presentation and garnered interest from conference attendees.

The conference provided meaningful opportunities for trainees of all levels. Geriatrics Interest Group (GIG) Co-Chair, Evelyn Cheung, noted that exposure to a wide range of research topics — including such topics as geriatrics oncology — was of particular interest as she explores com-

bined clinical and research career possibilities.

Raza Naqvi (PGY3), was awarded the CIHR Institute of Aging *Réjean Hébert* prize in Geriatric Research. This annual prize is given out the medical resident in either a core or primary residency program for the best scientific presentation. Raza, who will be commencing his geriatrics training at UofT this July, shared that his own passion was strengthened by the

phenomenal atmosphere created by the caliber of speakers and thought provoking discussions. Raza also presented a systemic review that he has been working on in conjunction with Dr. Sharon Straus.

Congratulations to Angela Liu, a second year medical student, who received an award for her "Cognition and functional ability in older adults with schizophrenia" presentation.

Travel grants were offered by the Division of Geriatric Medicine and Baycrest to support program and medical school trainees' attendance at this national event. 

CMAJ Article a Call to Action to End Ageism in Medical Education

In a recent article published by CMAJ, medical student Nathan Stall expresses his concern that medical education is unfairly biased against the care of older adults.

In his article, he elucidates that ageism is entrenched within the structure of formal education curricula as there is limited exposure to geriatrics clinical rotations within Canadian medical schools and the absence of cases that reflect older adults with complex comorbidities.

• Selling yard goods at Jack's Fabrics in Port Chester New York when I was 15.

The one gadget or piece of gear that I could not do without is:

• Portable BGAN satellite uplink for internet and phone. It's the size and weight of an average hardcover novel and can be powered by portable solar panels. Invaluable when working off the grid in Rwanda or Sudan! I carry it for emergencies, to read the New York Times online and to call home from places like the middle of the Sahara to check what my family is having for supper in Cabbagetown.
