This 11th Annual Research Day welcomes clinicians in quality improvement, teachers, educators, scientists, investigators, and all medical learners. This event provides a forum to showcase research, foster connections, and strengthen the culture of research excellence within our vibrant division

GIM Research Day – Call for Abstracts:

1. **Eligibility:** All trainees == including residents, medical students, graduate students, and other learners – are eligible to submit abstracts if they are working with a primary supervising GIM faculty member (senior author) who attends on GIM clinical services or holds a primary or cross-appointment in GIM. In addition, all GIM PGY4 residents are encouraged, and PGY5 residents are required, to submit abstracts regardless of whether they are working with a GIM faculty. Any study that has not been published at the time of submission is eligible.
2. Abstracts should provide a clear summary of work using the following structure: a) Title, b) Background/Objective, c) Methods, d) Results, e) Conclusion. Word length of 350 words. Please identify all co-authors and affiliations, list word count and corresponding author information on submission. Submit as either a word document or PDF.
3. A limited number of abstracts will be selected for oral presentations as part of the research competition, while others will be selected for poster presentations. The first-place winner in the oral presentation category will receive the **Dr. Jack V Tu Award** (\$250), and the second-place winner will receive \$150. The best poster will receive the **Dr. Murray Krahn Award for Research** (\$250), and the second-place poster winner will receive \$150. Please indicate if you prefer **not** to be considered for an oral presentation.
4. Research may include studies in clinical epidemiology, public or global health, quality improvement, health services research, decision science, health technology assessment, health economics, shared decision making, biostatistics, qualitative research, Indigenous health, medical education, knowledge translation or other areas. Case reports may be submitted for presentation as posters, however, they will not be included in the judging process.
5. Only one person may present and this should be the lead author of the abstract.
6. Multiple abstracts can be submitted. A maximum of one abstract per author will be selected for oral presentations.

DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSIONS: Friday, February 20, 2026 at 5pm EST.
