
### **Teacher Evaluation Project**

#### Objective: To Increase the number of teacher evaluations received in our Division

We have consistently faced challenges with many members of our division—both clinician teachers and investigators—regarding the collection of teacher evaluations for promotional purposes. Over the summer, Dr. Cheng, Dr. <u>Arman Zereshkian</u> (PGY5), Dr. Mateus Cunha (Fellow), and student Chris Cha embarked on a small study to investigate the issues surrounding teacher evaluations.

Currently, we utilize the POWER evaluation tool, which requires students to select a teacher for evaluation. We also have myTEprof.com, available since 2014, with a recent update that includes a QR code. While this tool is teacher-initiated, it can be time-consuming and is not widely known.

Our goal for this year is to actively promote the use of myTE by generating QR codes for all our teachers, making the process easily accessible and as effortless as possible. We will pilot this initiative at <u>Sunnybrook</u> first, with plans to expand to other <u>centers</u> in January 2025.

We are actively in discussion with the restructuring of the MOTP teaching awards and creation of some new awards. Stay tune for more updates in 2025.



Anthony Lott and Suneil Khanna recently started to coordinate the Academic Half-Day with the help of our Chief Residents, <u>Coralea Kappel</u> and David Nguyen (2023-2024) and <u>Arman Zereskhian</u> and Patrick <u>Hoang</u> (2024-2025).

We were tasked to update the AHD curriculum based on the Royal College Medical Oncology Competencies and the recently-published ESMO/ASCO Recommendations for Global Curriculum in Medical Oncology. Using these curricula as a rough guide, we've split the year into a block-based system. Within each block, we've scheduled lectures from both medical oncologists as well as lectures from colleagues in complementary specialties. We're also aiming to set up at least two multidisciplinary days, incorporating trainees across Medical Oncology, Rad Onc, and Surg Onc.

So far, we've had excellent buy in and participation from all our colleagues - we appreciate the time everybody has spent on developing their teaching materials. Huge thanks to <u>Arman</u> and Patrick, <u>Walaa</u>, and all of our lecturers. Going forward, we'll work with the Committee to develop awards for exemplary AHD teaching.

# Spotlight on our Clinician Teachers!



**Dr. Ron Burkes is** Professor of Medicine at The University of Toronto and staff medical oncologist at Mount Sinai Hospital/Princess Margaret Cancer Centre/University Health Network in Toronto. He was on the medical oncology training committee for the University of Toronto for 23 years and the program director for the medical oncology training program from 1996 to 2005 during which time he introduced the academic half day, the longitudinal clinic experience, the annual medical oncology research day and the staff medical oncology outstanding teaching awards. He was also the director of the Clinical Teaching Unit at the PMCC from 1999 to 2005 and established the teaching curriculum for the internal medicine residents rotating through the PMCC. He is now the Medical Oncology Mentorship Facilitator for the Division of Medical Oncology, Department of Medicine, University of Toronto.

He has won numerous teaching awards including Departmental and University wide awards on 18 occasions, the Anderson Award in Program Development and the <u>Hasselback</u> Teaching Award at PMCC. He has presented at many local, provincial, national and international meetings.

His research interests include lung and GI malignancies with a primary interest in lung, colorectal and gastric cancers. He has numerous publications including 130 peer reviewed, 154 non-peer reviewed and 2 book chapters.



**Dr. Christine Elser** is an Associate Professor at the <u>Temerty</u> Faculty of Medicine at the University of Toronto and a member of the Department of Medical Oncology at Mount Sinai Hospital. She has completed her undergraduate and postgraduate medical training in Germany, a Masters in Epidemiology at the University of Cambridge, UK and a Drug development fellowship at Princes Margaret Cancer Centre.

Dr <u>Elser's</u> clinical focus is the management of breast cancer and of individuals at high risk for the disease. She is leading the Familial Breast Cancer program at Mount and Breast Cancer in Pregnancy Program at Sinai and is involved in clinical research including many clinical trials in this field.

As a Clinician Teacher she is passionate about teaching and has received several undergraduate and postgraduate teaching awards for her work including the Department of Medicine Individual Teaching Award 2018, the U of T Medical Oncology Outstanding Teaching Award 2020, and the MD program Teaching Award of Excellence in 2022 and 2023. She the director of the Mount Sinai Oncology Fellowship, a member of the Medical Oncology Training Committee, and the GIM competence committee amongst other roles. Dr. Elser is developing new experiences and resources for non-oncology and allied health related to her clinical interests including pregnancy in breast cancer.



Dr. Geoffrey Watson is a Staff Medical Oncologist at Mount Sinai Hospital and an Assistant Professor of Medicine at the University of Toronto. He completed his basic and specialized training in medical oncology in Dublin, Ireland. Dr. Watson joined the Drug Development and Sarcoma Programs at the Princess Margaret Cancer Centre as a clinical research fellow in 2019. Dr. Watson was appointed as a staff medical oncologist at Mount Sinai Hospital and University Health Network in 2022. He is currently the Integrated Clinical Experience (ICE) Year 1 Site Coordinator at Mount Sinai Hospital and an Internal Medicine Academic Advisor and a Faculty Career Advisor in the Temerty Faculty of Medicine, University of Toronto. He has also served as Interim Clerkship Co-Director at Mount Sinai Hospital from May 2023 until March 2024. His academic interest is in patient education, and he has won several awards and grants including an American Association for Cancer Education (AACE) Grant in Research, Education, Advocacy, and Direct Service (READS), 2023 MSH Innovation in Education Award and the Pfizer Global Medical Quality Initiative Grant.



**Dr. Coralea Kappel** graduated as valedictorian from the University of Ottawa Medical School and completed her Internal Medicine residency at McMaster University. Following this, she completed her Medical Oncology residency at the University of Toronto where she also served as co-chief resident. Dr. Kappel is currently honing herexpertise with a fellowship in breast and gastrointestinal malignancies at PrincessMargaret Hospital and starting as a medical oncologist at the Hudson Regional CancerCentre in Barrie. Alongside her clinical work, she is completing the Master TeacherProgram, PGME Leadership Certificate and the Global Oncology LeadershipDevelopment Program with the University of Toronto. Her research interests are <u>incardio-oncology</u> and medical education. Outside of medicine, Dr. Kappel enjoysrunning, golfing, cycling, skiing and performing with the Huronia Symphony Orchestra.
