We had a number of accreditation meetings which required considerable preparation, but went exceedingly well. This includes not only preparation of excellent documentation but also a number of preparatory meetings and other work that went into the visit. We also want to thank all the faculty, residents and support staff who made this successful review possible. We have not yet had official word from The Royal College, but initial feedback has been quite positive.

Lisa Becker has sent an email from the exit meeting which took place.

"The following key points were highlighted:

- We are being recommended for Full Accreditation with regular review This is the highest category available and means that we will not require additional external review for 8 years!
- Our teaching faculty stood out as being extremely engaged in resident education, collaborative and collegial.
   They were impressed by the number of faculty who showed up with cameras on for the faculty meeting, RPC meeting and CC meeting
- We have 2 of the happiest Program Assistants in the Department of Medicine who are invaluable
- Our residents are EXTREMELY happy! (These were the words of the accreditors)
- We have impressive research and quality improvement programs


#### 8. Can you help Larry Robinson with efficiency recommendations?
